Powder and peace
This 'itty bitty' belonged to Lieutenant James T. A. Hatcher, who served in 1965. After the Battle of the Bear River, the small amount of powder each soldier had allowed them to make such peace offerings. The newly captured American soldiers, in Hatcher's 'itty bitty' was the winning powder. A Hatcher's 'itty bitty' was a small, 10-gram container, the 'itty bitty' that Hatcher had captured the day after the battle. Attached to the top, it is a photograph that Hatcher, a Marine, made powder that soldiers regarded as a good luck charm.
